Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

- •Students need to complete the FAFSA every year.
 - Must be in an approved degree/certificate program
 - Must be a U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen
- •Funds you are applying for by completing the FAFSA:
 - Pell Grants Funds offered based off of student financial need
 - Student Loans
 - Subsidized Need Based
 - Unsubsidized-
 - Work-study (Need Based)

Priority Deadlines:

June 1st – Fall Semester

November 1st – Spring Semester

February 1st – Summer Semester



Pell Grant:

- Is offered only to undergraduate students who display exceptional financial need and have not earned a Bachelor's Degree, Graduate Degree, or Professional Degree
- A Federal Pell Grant, unlike a loan, does not have to be repaid, except under certain circumstances
- The Pell Grant award offer adjusts according to the credits you are enrolled in for the term
- Initial Pell award offers are based on full time enrollment. Pell will reduce if you are registered for less then Full Time enrollment 12+ Credits
- Pell Grant will automatically pay towards tuition and fees
 - Left over funds will be issued to the student by the Cashier's Office and will show as a negative balance in Self-Service
 - Refund checks will be provided no earlier than the Friday before classes start each semester



Student Loans

- <u>Subsidized Loan (FDSL)</u> Does not accrue interest while the student is enrolled at least half time (6 credits) until student graduates
- <u>Unsubsidized (FDUL)</u>- Interest will accrue while the student is attending school. Interest is not compounded
- Both Subsidized and Unsubsidized loans are deferred while the student is attending at least half time (6 Credits)
- To be awarded loans a student must:
 - Complete a FAFSA
 - Be enrolled at least half-time (6 credits) in an eligible program
 - Accept the loan on Self-Service
 - Complete Loan Entrance Counseling
 - Complete a Master Promissory Note



Loans Continued

- •First time borrowers who are first time CEI students will have to wait 30 days from the beginning of the semester before their <u>loan funds</u> will be disbursed
- •These are regulatory requirements and as such will require your acknowledgement of this information
 - Please send an email to financial.aid@cei.edu indicating your understanding
- •Left over funds will be issued to the student by the Cashier's Office
 - Refund checks will be provided no earlier than the Friday before classes start
- •Pell Grant funds will **not** be delayed for first time loan borrowers

Work-Study

- •Federal and State Work-Study funding is offered to students who demonstrate financial need and want to work while attending college
- •As a work-study student you will gain valuable skills in a variety of different environments, build professional relationships, and still be able to focus on your educational goals
- •Positions available are 10-19 hours per week in various departments on campus
- •Work-Study students earn \$10.50 an hour

Work-Study Continued

- •To receive Work-Study students must:
 - Fill out their FAFSA application for the current academic year
 - Be awarded financial aid
 - Be enrolled in a financial aid eligible program
 - Have Work-Study eligibility
- How to apply
 - Job Openings listed on CEI website under, "Financial Aid, Student Work-Study."
 - Request an application to apply for a Work-Study position.

Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)

Satisfactory Academic Progress, or SAP, is the policy in place to make sure that students remain eligible to receive federal financial aid.

- Student must make SAP to continue to qualify for financial aid
- SAP will be reviewed at the end of each semester to determine compliance
- Must maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0
- Must complete 67% of the courses that are attempted
- If a student fails to meet the minimum qualifications a student may be placed on Financial Aid Warning
- Students who fail or withdraw all attempted courses, will be denied Financial Aid
- Subsequent incidents of SAP violations will result in suspension of Financial Aid



Scholarships

- What is a scholarship?
 - A grant or payment made to support a student's education, awarded on the basis of academic or other achievement.
- •What should I do if I have been awarded a scholarship?
 - Ensure donor has sent check to the institution.
 - Provide proof of scholarship to Financial Aid or CEI Foundation
- •How is my scholarship applied?
 - Scholarships are typically applied to tuition and fees first.
 - Scholarships may have unique requirements or restrictions; refer to your award letter or contact your donor for more information.
